Course Description

Introduction: The course targets the learning requirements of academics, students and professionals currently studying or working in the fields of social work, social policy, international aid, public health, social development, community and youth work, social pedagogy and migration, social inclusion and cultural studies. Students will engage with current interdisciplinary theories, debates and international case studies for an in-depth understanding as to the impact of migration on the rights, welfare and wellbeing of youth, children and families, together with future societal challenges. This course is accredited for selected UEF PhD and MA programs and provides students with an excellent opportunity to study over the summer break.

Duration and credits: Two weeks, 5 ECTS (with an option for 3 ECTS)

Responsible Departments: The two responsible departments are Social Sciences and Law School, Faculty of Social Sciences and Business Studies.

Learning outcomes: Students will engage with current interdisciplinary theories, debates and international case studies and undertake field visits for an in-depth understanding as to the impact of migration on the rights, welfare and wellbeing of youth, children and families, together with future societal challenges of integration and inclusion.

Modes of study and program: The course will involve a combination of formal lectures, tutorials, workshops, and student presentations. Students will be expected to prepare for lectures by reading the recommended articles and actively participating in tutorial discussions, led by the guest lecturers.

Study materials: To be provided through online platform DigiCampuksen. Instructions on how to register on DigiCampus will be provided to students via email in mid-July.

Credit options: 3 ECTS: Attending the lectures, and a short assignment and in class group presentation or 5 ECTS: As above, and an additional final assignment.

Assignments:

Pre Course Assignment 1: Preparatory readings to be available on line from DigiCampuksen. Not assessed.

Pre Course Assignment 2: Preparatory assignment. Outline a case study (relevant to your local context) illustrating the impact of migration on family lives and/or child development. Total word count 1,500 words-between 3 to 4 pages. Assessed (grading scale 0-5) and due on the 9.08.19.

Assignment 3: In class oral presentations. Small groups of students will deliver a 20-minute oral in class presentation (i.e. power point, audio-visual, interactive method) critically examining the needs and rights of migrant families, children or youth. Assessed as pass/fail

Assignment 4 (optional for 5 credits only): Students are required to select at least one key question relating to the impact of migration on families, youth or children arising from the course. Students will have the opportunity to discuss their selected topics with the guest lecturers through the tutorial program. Total word count 3000 words. Assessed (graded scale 0-5). To be uploaded on to DigiCampuksen

Teachers: A team of international professors in social work, demography, social policy, sociology, psychology, history and social pedagogy will deliver the program.
